Sharing Prayer Concerns

Dear Church Family,

Prayer is a powerful tool that connects us to God and allows us to seek His guidance, comfort, and intervention in our lives. In the church community, it is common practice to share prayer requests with one another so that we can lift each other up in prayer and support.

However, there is a delicate balance that must be struck when sharing prayer requests. By doing so, we not only honor the individual's privacy and dignity, but also cultivate a culture of love, respect, and trust within our community. As we lift each other up in prayer, let's focus on humility, sensitivity, and grace, knowing that God hears our prayers and works all things for the good of those who love Him.


